# Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at Honolulu, Hawaii, 1900–1953

#### Introduction

On the 269 rolls of this microfilm publication, A3422, are reproduced passenger lists of vessels arriving at Honolulu, Hawaii, February 13, 1900–Dec. 30, 1953. These records are part of Records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Record Group (RG) 85.

#### BACKGROUND

Early records relating to immigration originated in regional customhouses. The U.S. Customs Service conducted its business by designating collection districts. Each district had a headquarters port with a customhouse and a collector of customs, the chief officer of the district. An act of March 2, 1819 (3 Stat. 489), required the captain or master of a vessel arriving at a port in the United States or any of its territories from a foreign country to submit a list of passengers to the collector of customs. The act also required that the collector submit a quarterly report or abstract, consisting of copies of these passenger lists, to the Secretary of State, who was required to submit such information at each session of Congress. After 1874, collectors forwarded only statistical reports to the Treasury Department. The lists themselves were retained by the collector of customs. Customs records were maintained primarily for statistical purposes.

On August 3, 1882, Congress passed the first Federal law regulating immigration (22) Stat. 214–215); the Secretary of the Treasury had general supervision over it between 1882 and 1891. The Office of Superintendent of Immigration in the Department of the Treasury was established under an act of March 3, 1891 (26 Stat. 1085), and was later designated a bureau in 1895 with responsibility for administering the alien contract-labor laws. In 1900 administration of the Chinese exclusion laws was added. Initially the Bureau retained the same administrative structure of ports of entry that the Customs Service had used. By the turn of the century, it began to designate its own immigration districts, the numbers and boundaries of which changed over the years. In 1903 the Bureau became part of the Department of Commerce and Labor; its name was changed to the Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization when functions relating to naturalization were added in 1906. In 1933 the functions were transferred to the Department of Labor and became the responsibility of the newly formed Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). Under President Roosevelt's Reorganization Plan V of 1940, the INS was moved to the Department of Justice. The INS was abolished in 2003, and its immigration and naturalization recordkeeping functions were transferred to the new Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services within the new Department of Homeland Security, established January 24, 2003, by the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (116 Stat. 2135, 2205).

#### RECORDS DESCRIPTION

The vessel passenger lists include both alien and U.S. citizen arrivals. Passenger names are recorded on a variety of forms, including INS Form 500-B and variants such as Form 1500-B, as well as steamship company forms.

INS Form 500-B (or 1500-B, etc.), List or Manifest of Alien Passengers for the U.S. Immigration Officer at Port of Arrival, is a large, multiple-page "sheet manifest" traditionally used by vessel masters to record information about ship passengers in advance of arrival at U.S. ports. Form 500-B (or 1500-B) includes the date of arrival, full name, age, sex, marital status, occupation, ability to read and write, citizenship ("nationality"), "race or people," town and country of last permanent residence, birthplace, final destination, and whether the individual possesses a ticket to final destination. It also includes the name and address of the friend or relative the alien intends to join. If the alien had ever been in the U.S. in the past, the dates and places of such residence or visitation are indicated. It also includes the alien's height and color of complexion, eyes, and hair. Not all of the above information may be recorded for every alien on these forms or on forms published by the steamship companies.

The passenger lists are arranged in chronological order by date of arrival at Honolulu, but there is some disarrangement, particularly in some of the earliest volumes. The INS bound the passenger lists into "books" or volumes. The first page of most volumes is a "volume index page" that indicates the page number upon which each vessel's manifests begins. Researchers interested in a particular vessel should begin their search by consulting the volume index page or Microfilm Publication A3391, *Indexes to Vessels Arriving at* (1852–1948) and Departing from (1900–1949) Honolulu, Hawaii (1 roll), in case the manifest of interest is not in the correct chronological sequence. Some, but not all, of the manifests out of chronological sequence are noted in the roll list that follows.

#### RELATED RECORDS

The passenger manifests in this microfilm publication are indexed by four other National Archives microfilm publications:

A3391, *Indexes to Vessels Arriving at (1852–1948) and Departing from (1900–1949) Honolulu, Hawaii* (1 roll), provides an index to vessel arrivals. For each vessel, the following information is given: name of vessel, date of arrival, whether it embarked from a foreign or "mainland" port, book (volume) number, and sheet number. For the purposes of this index, "mainland" ports included those in the United States and Canada. The "sheet number" refers to a mechanically stamped number on the first page of the ship's manifest.

A3407, *Index to Filipino Passengers Arriving at Honolulu, Hawaii, ca. 1900–ca.* 1952 (19 rolls), is an alphabetically arranged index to Filipinos other than those in A3411. The index provides the date and vessel of arrival and may also specify the volume, page, and line number where the person's manifest will be found

A3410, *Index to Passengers, not Including Filipinos, Arriving at Honolulu, Hawaii, ca. 1900–ca. 1952* (37 rolls), is an alphabetically arranged index to persons who are not Filipinos. The index provides the date and vessel of arrival and may also specify the volume, page, and line number where the person's manifest will be found. This index primarily includes aliens. Citizens of Pacific-rim nations such as Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Russia, and Canada are common, but there are also aliens from Portugal, Spain, and elsewhere. There are a few U.S. citizens.

A3411, *Index to Filipino Contract Laborers and their Wives and Children Arriving at Honolulu, Hawaii, 1946* (1 roll), is an alphabetically arranged index to Filipinos who were recruited for work in Hawaii's sugar plantations in 1946 whose manifests are in volumes 366 and 367. The index provides the volume, page, and line number where the person's manifest will be found.

#### GENERAL REMARKS

The records were filmed for the INS in 1954 and 1955 by the Microphotographic Service, Office of Records Administration, Administrative Office, U.S. Navy Department (as indicated by the original film's original box markings) and transferred to the National Archives on microfilm. The microfilm exhibits poor contrast and other technical problems. Although some of this film may be difficult to read, it is impossible to correct the situation since the INS destroyed the original records.
